INTRODUCING KARA DAVIDSON

We are excited to introduce you to Kara Davidson, Paramount's new Director of New Works and Associate Artistic Producer. She comes to Paramount with over 15 years of professional experience in the field including acting, playwrighting, directing, teaching, arts administration and theater management. Kara



holds an MFA in playwriting and screenwriting from the University of Nebraska at Omaha and a BA in Theatre Performance from University of Nebraska, Lincoln. She has worked in theaters throughout the Midwest and Great Plains at various capacities. What drew her specifically to Paramount was the position our theater has to cultivate new works and the commitment it has made to support playwrights, artists and accessibility.

So what does a New Works Director do? Well, Kara considers herself a shepherd. She is responsible for making connections with playwrights and creating opportunities for them to showcase their works and ushering them through different stages of the creative process. In short, Kara helps to bolster and support the artists and thus elevate the artistic community experience as a whole.

For Kara creating a new work is very similar to the application of the scientific method; one starts with an idea and goes through a lot of trial and error before it's ready to take stage. New works take years of development and with Kara's appointment she is excited to pull back the curtain and invite the public into the process. This means there will be future opportunities during which you, our audience, will be invited to readings and showcases so that you can follow along with us from the inception stages of a new project. For her first year at Paramount, Kara is focused on developing relationships with the local and national artistic community to help create a pipeline of projects at various stages of development which need further support—that's where Paramount comes in, to provide that support through our expert staff and facilities. New works will focus on art that reflects our cultural moments and to help support and cultivate artists who tell these vital stories.

How can you help support New Works at Paramount? Kara is passionate about providing a variety of developmental opportunities for creators of any age, demographic, background, and experience level. In addition to hosting readings and presentations of new plays and musicals, initiatives will also include: a Young Playwrights Festival which will support high school age playwrights by offering an opportunity to showcase their original work to the Paramount community, free workshops and educational offerings for both established and new playwrights, as well as events to build

connections with local, national and international artists who are creating exciting new experiences for the stage. We're excited to have Kara join our team and to continue growing our New Works program.

R.C. WEGMAN AND THE IMPORTANCE OF LEGACY GIVING

R.C. Wegman has been a part of the Aurora area since 1955, with over 62 years of business experience and community involvement. This family-run business has been a Paramount supporter since 2014. We recently sat down with Colette Rozanski, current president of R.C. Wegman, and former president Terry Bohr for a conversation on their family legacy and support of Paramount.

Do you have a favorite Paramount memory?

Terry: I can't really think of one favorite memory. We really love it every time we go to Paramount for a show. Probably some of our favorites have been seeing Donny and Marie, and Kenny Rodgers. My favorite Broadway show by far was *Million Dollar Quartet*.

That show was outstanding.

Colette: Seeing *Rent* in the front row. The voices and set were truly Broadway-caliber and really drew me into my love of the Broadway Series. I look forward to each new series announcement.

What do you love about our work?

Terry: Two things: the variety of shows and the quality. It seems like there is something for everyone no matter your age or taste, and the quality of the sets, the music, and the talent is always extraordinary.

Colette: I love the ambiance of the theater and the detailed set design, but most of all I love the variety of extraordinary talent the Paramount casts for each show.

Your family and firm have a historic connection to Paramount. What does that legacy mean to you?

Terry: It means a great deal to me. I am very proud to tell others that our firm was involved with the historic restoration of Paramount back in the late 70s. I was a young carpenter back then and I can still show my children and grandchildren the areas I worked on at that time. The restoration was a very significant occurrence for the City, and I am very proud to have played a part in it.



How has that investment in Paramount changed Aurora over the years?

Colette: The change has been dramatic. Paramount and RiverEdge Park are key to future development in downtown. As a child growing up in the late 80s and early 90s and attending *Downtown Alive!* and maybe one show a year at the Paramount, it went under-utilized. Now with the amazing acts and Broadway Series, Paramount truly keeps Aurora residents and visitors coming downtown year-round.

Terry: The change has been dramatic, for the better. With Paramount taking the lead, Aurora has the chance to be a very dynamic performing arts destination. I think the Paramount is the key to all future development in downtown.

What are you hoping to accomplish with your philanthropy as sponsors and individual donors?

Terry: We just want to see Paramount continue to do what it does best. Provide quality entertainment that brings others to Aurora. We want Paramount to continue to be the economic development engine that it is.

What is your dream for Paramount as we look to future generations in our community?

Colette: To be the number one theater destination in Illinois, with an equally sought-after school for the arts. **Terry:** To be the leader in growing the entertainment industry in Aurora.

While Colette carries on the family business and manages R.C. Wegman's relationship with Paramount, Terry continues to enjoy showing support for Paramount on a personal level. We owe a special thanks to both for their time and continued support of our theater. We are proud to be a part of their legacy and family history.
