Rep. Barbara Hernandez on the Importance of Funding the Arts

Here at Paramount Theatre, we have been incredibly fortunate to form a partnership with State Representative Barbara Hernandez. She was appointed as the 50th District State Representative in 2019 and has since worked tirelessly for her constituency and the city of Aurora.

Thanks to her advocacy for the arts and belief in our organization and mission, Rep. Hernandez has helped Paramount secure \$800,000 in state funding for capital projects needed to help our organization maintain a safe and accessible environment for our guests and our community.

We sat down briefly with Rep. Hernandez to ask her what motivates her support of our theatre and its role within the community.



What motivated you to support funding for Paramount Theatre?

As a child my dad always showed me the importance of theater and although growing up it was financially difficult to go to plays, he would find ways to still introduce them to me through film and free library discussions. Paramount Theatre was the first place I was able to experience a live play and I want children and families to have an opportunity to sit inside a theater and get inspired the same way I did.

How do you believe this funding will impact the local community economically and culturally?

The Paramount Theatre is the heart of Downtown Aurora. Families travel from many different parts of the state to witness the award-winning plays and patronize local businesses. Downtown Aurora has a lot to offer—Paramount and all its venues help bring more people to shop, eat and spend time in Aurora.

What role do you see the arts playing in public education, and how does Paramount contribute to that mission?

Paramount Theatre provides opportunities for kids to see what it takes to put on a play and engage them in exploring a potential career in theater. Paramount also creates opportunities for students to learn through Paramount School of the Arts and various volunteer activities and programs they offer in the community.

In times of budget constraints, what compels you to allocate public funds to the arts?

While government funding is currently uncertain, it is crucial to support our arts and give people the opportunity to enjoy it through programs like Pay What You Can at Paramount—offering families an opportunity to see a play and pay what they are able to helps tear down financial barriers to quality art.

Third Spark Lab Series Reading of 2025 Brings a Bilingual Musical to Paramount

Our brand-new program, the Spark Lab Series, part of our New Works department, continued to do important work and provide emerging artists and projects with important resources to have their art seen and heard. In May, we presented our third project in the Spark Lab Series, a bilingual (Spanish and English) musical in development, Mija. The workshop week for the creative team culminated in a concert reading performance of the script and score on May 17th, presented as a free offering thanks to our sponsors Aurora Women's Empowerment Foundation and Healing Illinois. The presentation welcomed over 100 attendees, including the author team of Grammy Award-winner Gaby Moreno, Portland singer-songwriter Anna Gilbert, Broadway artist Evynne Hollens and Seattle playwright Rebecca Touriño Collinsworth. The co-directing team featured two local Chicago directors, and the cast was made up of a mixture of local as well as Broadway talent.

Paramount New Works is excited to present its 4th Spark Lab event of the year this fall. Integrating technology, improvisation, and audience participation into a narrative storyline, this upcoming work-in-progress will be a unique theatrical experience open to the public to attend at no cost.
